



### **Alan N. Harris**

*Chief Development & Operations Officer

Alan Harris is chief development and operations officer of Spectra Energy Corp. In that dual role, he oversees the corporation's strategy, planning, business development and merger and acquisitions, as well as project execution, the operations of Spectra Energy's U.S. pipeline and storage business, environment, health and safety, procurement and Spectra Energy Partners, the company's master limited partnership. He also serves on the board of directors for DCP Midstream Partners, a midstream master limited partnership that gathers, processes, transports and markets natural gas and natural gas liquids and is a leading wholesale distributor of propane.

Prior to Spectra Energy's spin-off from Duke Energy, Harris served as group vice president and chief financial officer of Duke Energy Gas Transmission (DEGT). Harris joined the company in 1982 as director of gas accounting for Panhandle Eastern Pipe Line and Trunkline Gas. After a series of promotions within the controller's department, he was named controller of Trunkline in 1991, Texas Eastern Transmission in December 1995 and Algonquin Gas Transmission in 1997. He was named vice president of controllers and strategic planning in 1999 and treasurer in 2000. He served as senior vice president of strategic development and planning, a position he assumed in conjunction with Duke Energy's acquisition of Westcoast Energy Inc.

Harris was named executive vice president for DEGT in December 2002 responsible for strategic development, risk management, information technology and corporate reserves. He also had oversight of the company's East Tennessee Natural Gas pipeline and DEGT's interest in Maritimes & Northeast Pipeline and Gulfstream Natural Gas System. In 2004, Harris was named group vice president and chief financial officer for DEGT responsible for accounting, risk management, information technology and planning.

A certified public accountant, he is a member of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, the Oklahoma state board of public accountancy and the Financial Executives Institute. He served a two-year term as chairman of Interstate Natural Gas Association of America's (INGAA) accounting committee and is past chairman of the INGAA/FERC (Federal Energy Regulatory Commission) accounting liaison group.

The Sallisaw, Okla., native received a bachelor's degree in accounting from Northeastern Oklahoma State University in Tahlequah, Okla., and a master's degree in business administration from the University of Tulsa.

Born in 1953, he and his wife, Karen, have three daughters and two sons.
